"Mr. Kraft shared that he's a huge supporter of women's sports, and it made him proud to hear about our continued success."

Kraft hosted the defending champs for a special visit in the trophy room, gifting them custom team hats and joining them for photos alongside the Patriots' six Super Bowl trophies and rings. Once they soaked in their championship moment in the trophy room, the team headed to the stadium field for photos, a game of catch and to see a special congratulations message displayed on the scoreboard. After a long season of hard work and dedication culminated in a 73-53 win over Dracut in the state championship game, the team reveled in the opportunity to celebrate their accomplishment in style at Gillette Stadium. Senior co-captain and shooting guard Maddie Maher called the day a "once-in-a-lifetime experience" and reflected on what the opportunity meant to her

as both a player and a lifelong Foxborough resident.

"It meant the world to us to be recognized by such a prestigious organization for our accomplishments," Maher said. "Being invited to the stadium showed us how our success was bigger than just ourselves. I am beyond appreciative of the generosity of Mr. Kraft and the stadium for their time and effort to make this happen for us."

One of Maher's fellow captains, lifelong resident and junior guard Camryn Collins, echoed her appreciation for the experience.

"I was extremely excited and glad to be able to go and see Mr. Kraft supporting women's sports," Collins said. "It meant so much on behalf of our team and coaching staff because we got to see how big of a support system we have. I really appreciated the whole trip and the efforts of Mr. Kraft and the organization to put everything together to welcome and congratulate us."

Slated to be a captain next



season, 10-year resident and junior shooting guard Erin Foley pointed to visiting the trophy room and receiving customized Patriots hats from Kraft as two highlights from the visit.

"We were all super excited and couldn't wait to meet [Kraft]," Foley said. "It was an incredible honor to be recognized by such a large organization at such a nice stadium with my teammates and coaches."

This year's visit marked the second time Kraft has

welcomed the team to Gillette Stadium to celebrate a state title. Downs points to the experience as a great reminder of the many ways hard work can pay off.

"The support from the Kraft family and the opportunity to celebrate at Gillette Stadium was such an added bonus feature to our successful season," Downs said. "I am a Foxborough 'townie' and knowing that we have such support from this generous organization makes me extremely proud."

Two concerts, PLL Quarterfinals added to loaded summer

The announcements just keep coming for Gillette Stadium's record-breaking summer. After last quarter's newly added Bruce Springsteen and The E Street Band show pushed the summer total to a venue-record 10 shows, recent announcements of a second Luke Combs show and a newly added Karol G concert bring the updated tally to an unprecedented 12 concerts.

First up, to meet the demand of his New England fanbase, Combs

added a second show at Gillette Stadium, making his debut at the home of the Patriots on July 21 & 22 as part of his 2023 World Tour. The country superstar was joined in Foxborough by special guests including The Avett Brothers, Riley Green, Lainey Wilson and more throughout the weekend.

Global superstar Karol G will then make her Gillette Stadium debut on Sept. 28 as part of her Mañana Será Bonito Stadium Tour. The multi-platinum global recording artist and international pop culture icon recently became the first female artist to reach #1 on the Billboard Top 200 with a Spanish-language album and will now become the first Spanish-language artist to headline the home of the Patriots and Revolution when she takes the stage this fall. Tickets are still available at Ticketmaster.com.

Additionally, the Premier Lacrosse League has announced the schedule for the 2023 playoff quarterfinals. For the second consecutive season, Gillette Stadium will host three single elimination quarterfinal matchups, as teams kick off their quest for the 2023 PLL Championship on Sept. 4. The quarterfinals will get underway with the first game at 11:45 a.m., followed by a game at 2:20 p.m., before a 5 p.m. matchup rounds out the triple-header. Tickets for the single-elimination showdowns are on sale at PremierLacrosse-League.com/Boston.

FHS Students Design Concert Series Mural at Patriot Place

It's a record-breaking Gillette Stadium Concert Series presented by Dunkin', and such an occasion calls for something special. Ahead of the summer slate, Patriot Place Director of Marketing and lifelong Foxborough resident Diana Griffin enlisted the help of local burgeoning artists to help commemorate a notable summer in the O2O35. Griffin and the Patriot Place team didn't have to look far, reaching out to the Foxborough High School art department with the opportunity to design a mural encapsulating the 2023 Concert Series to be displayed at Patriot Place all summer long.

FHS' Graphic Design 2 and Senior Inc. art classes met the challenge head-on under the guidance of Kelly Arcacha, K-12 art department head and an art teacher with Foxborough Public Schools for more than 20 years. Led by Arcacha, the students each created a mural design using the design thinking process.



The students began the process with definition, where they consulted with staff from Patriot Place and outlined the project's requirements. Next up was ideation, where the students conducted research and selected a color palette, layout and fonts for

the mural. As the students designed their digital murals, they drew inspiration from a playlist of music from the artists performing at Gillette Stadium this summer.

The team at Patriot Place then evaluated the students' mural submissions, voting on the design that they felt best represented the upcoming concert season. The winning mural, designed by FHS junior and National Art Honor Society member Lydia Stone, is now on display in Patriot Place's North Marketplace for guests to enjoy and take photos with all summer long.

"Seeing Lydia's design printed along the North Marketplace was and continues to be surreal," Arcacha said. "We were incredibly fortunate to be able to experience the piece together as a class, on a field trip to Patriot Place and the look of awe in the students' eyes seeing something they watched being designed on the computer out in the world is something I'll always remember."

Patriot Place and the art department are longtime partners, dating back to 2013 through the Foxborough Street Painting Festival hosted annually at Patriot Place, and this latest project was just another shining example of this winning partnership.

"I am incredibly grateful to Diana and Patriot Place for this amazing opportunity for our students," Arcacha said. "One of the students mentioned how they didn't know if they would've ever been able to do something like this if they didn't go to FHS. I agree; there is something remarkably special about Foxborough and the support of this community."

Foxborough Working Mothers Enjoy Gillette Stadium Brunch

The saying goes that parenting is a full-time job. Pair that with a career as a second full-time job and it can be hard to find the time for anything else. Earlier this spring, a group of residents who juggle both on a daily basis enjoyed some much-deserved time for themselves. The Kraft family welcomed members of the Foxborough Working Mothers group to Gillette Stadium for a special brunch to connect, share their stories and celebrate their accomplishments with one another (and maybe enjoy a mimosa or two).

Founded in 2016 by Carolyn Cahill and Sarah Caracciolo, Foxborough Working Mothers is a Facebook group made up of 1,800 mothers. The community provides members with a space to lend support and guidance to one another as they navigate motherhood and professional life. This support went from online to real life, as over 150 working moms gathered to enjoy a complimentary meal, mingle and hear from four speakers from the group, who discussed the importance of self-care, work-life balance and reaching out for help.

After building this online community, lifelong Foxborough resident and cofounder Caracciolo pointed to being able to bring it offline and connect with members face-to-face at an iconic setting like Gillette Stadium as a huge highlight.

"This was a tribute to working moms. To have it in our backyard at the home of our beloved Patriots was an amazing piece to bring it all together," Caracciolo said. "We drive by Gillette Stadium every single day, yet we looked like a bunch of giddy tourists because that day was about us as working moms. To be guests of honor at Gillette Stadium made this an unparalleled event."

The moms in attendance shared in Caracciolo's appreciation for the event and the group, pointing to the brunch as a perfect way to commemorate Foxborough's working moms.

"What a way to celebrate great women in a great town. We all felt seen and appreciated," said 11-year resident Carrie Weston. "There's so much good information shared and it's such a supportive and caring environment."

As Weston mentioned, one of the group's benchmarks is members sharing their own experiences and insights to help others. The brunch continued this theme as four working moms took the time to address the group on a variety of topics. For 23-year resident Sarah LiDonni, hearing from these speakers stood out as a highlight of the event.

"The speakers really just struck me right in the heart," LiDonni said. "Being able to go up in front of your peers and have that amount of bravery and courage – it's amazing how real, genuine and honest all the women in the room were."

"We cannot thank the Kraft family and the New England Patriots enough," Caracciolo concluded. "This day was a gift, and one we will simply never forget. Our gratitude is beyond words."

For Foxborough resident Mike Sandler and his brother Scott, the Patriots are in their blood, passed down from generation to generation dating back to when the team was founded in 1960. With these decades of dedication, it's only fitting that the Sandler family is our latest Season Ticket Member Spotlight. The family first moved to town in 2001, a move Mike partially attributes to a desire to be closer to the stadium and the team. But the family's lifelong love for the Pats far predates the move to town, dating back to their late grandfather, who they affectionately refer to as "Papa Joe."

Papa Joe was in on the team from the beginning, grabbing season tickets in 1960 and instilling a love of football in his son, and Mike and Scott's father, Frank "Frankie Football" Sandler. As soon as the team made the permanent move to Foxborough in 1971, Frank leapt at the chance to get his own season tickets, which have stayed in the family ever since.

"Because of his dad, he wanted to have that same thing with his boys," Mike said. "Now we want to have that same thing with the next generation. It's a family tradition that gets us all together and keeps us all together."

This family tradition has the added benefit of six Super Bowl trophies and countless memories over the years. The Sandlers started out with four seats but five fans between Joe, Frank, Mike, Scott and their other brother Brian, necessitating a rotation between the brothers that would occasionally end in tears if a big game was on the line. Now the family has six seats in Section 134, allowing Mike to continue the tradition with his own children. The Sandler brothers first started to go to games when they were six years old, with Frank toting a crate into games for the boys to sit on so they could see the field. From crates to championships: as the decades passed and the team rose the NFL ranks, the Sandlers were there every step of the way. When the Pats made Super Bowl XXXVI in 2001, there was no way they were missing it. Frank was able to secure a pair of tickets, with Scott getting to go alongside his dad after a flip of a coin went his way. But while Papa Joe, Mike and the rest of the family weren't there in person, they certainly were in spirit. After Joe got older and could no longer make it to the stadium for games, the rest of the family began a tradition of calling him from the tailgate before each game. This phone call carried on to the Super Bowl, with Scott and Frank hunting down a pay phone after Adam Vinatieri's clinching kick sailed through the uprights to share in the joy of the team's first title with Joe and Mike

"As soon as the ball went through those goal posts, that was my first call," Mike said. "That call for me was as special as the game, if not more. It all comes down to Papa Joe starting everything. He still lives on today."

That 2001 title kicked off an unprecedented run of success, with the Sandlers enjoying a front-row seat to all of it. Whenever the Patriots made the Super Bowl, odds were

that the Sandlers were there too, with Frank attending six, Scott five and Mike four. All in all, the brothers estimate a Sandler has been in the building for 90% of all Patriots home games in history. Even through years when the team underperformed, a love for the team and each other kept them coming back.

"It's the New England way. We don't give up,"
Mike said. "Being together is a big reason too.
We didn't have to worry about seeing each other
because we always knew we would."

"We're a close family," added Scott. "Football was something we knew we could do together, and we'd always be there every Sunday. Papa Joe got it started, he was a character, and as the patriarch of the family, everyone looked up to him."

As the years went on, things changed but the family's passion for the Pats and love for going to games together stayed the same. Joe passed away in 2007, but the family relished the opportunity to share three Super Bowl titles with him, as well as the chance to experience a game with him in a brand-new Gillette Stadium after years of taking in the action from Foxboro Stadium. In 2015, Mike moved back to Foxborough to start his family, raising his kids in the shadow of the stadium he had spent so many Sundays before. Then in 2021, Frank passed away, leaving behind a lasting legacy of family and football. Frank's superfandom and years of dedication to the team are commemorated with a display in the Patriots Hall of Fame presented by Raytheon Technologies and live on even more so in his family. When Frank passed away, Mike officially put the tickets in his name, but they continue to be shared and enjoyed by generations of Sandlers each season.

"Since the tickets were passed on to me, I have a plaque that says 'Michael Sandler, Season Ticket Member since 1971,' which means I've been a season ticket holder for negative 13 years, which is pretty cool to say," Mike said. "Foxborough and the community here mean a lot to us. The Patriots are a huge reason too. It keeps us together and it's something we want the younger generation to enjoy as much as we did growing up."



A Lasting Legacy: PIP Fund Continues Community Support

FOX-IN-THE-BORO FOXES UNVEILED THROUGHOUT TOWN

After a year-long process that went from idea to prototype to final works of art, the Fox-In-The-Boro art installation has come to life throughout town. This colorful outdoor art display was organized by the Foxborough Cultural Council and features five larger-than-life foxes, each painted by a local artist and displayed throughout Foxborough's uptown. This new installation will both promote the arts and serve as a fundraiser for the Cultural Council, as each fox will be auctioned off after two years, with all proceeds going to support future art projects and events in the Foxborough community.

The PIP Fund played a key role in this process, granting the Cultural Council \$7,550 for the initial prototype that got the project underway. From there, the continued support of the Foxborough community helped cover the remaining cost to bring the fox sculptures to life.

"To me personally, it's really important that these philanthropic arms of large institutions like the Patriots support these communities they call home," said Tiffany Elliott, a member of the Cultural Council and spokesperson for the Fox-in-the-Boro project. "I'm a very missiondriven individual and I work and volunteer to help society as a whole, and if that help is needed in my own backyard, then I'll roll up my sleeves and we'll get it done. I feel like the Patriots do that same thing within the community."


